

CALIFORNIA SUPPLY CHAIN TRANSPARENCY LAW

(CA CIVIL CODE § 1714.43)

CONSUMER DISCLOSURE

To combat slavery and human trafficking in its product material supply chains and in compliance with California Civil Code § 1714.43, Hunter Engineering Company (“Hunter”) hereby provides the following consumer information:

- (1) Hunter has not yet conducted or engaged others to conduct verification of product supply chains to evaluate and address risks of human trafficking and slavery.
- (2) Hunter has not yet conducted or engaged in an audit of suppliers to evaluate supplier compliance with company standards for trafficking and slavery in supply chains.
- (3) Hunter is in the process of initiating a contractual requirement that suppliers certify that their materials incorporated into Hunter products comply with the laws regarding slavery and human trafficking of the country or countries in which they do business.
- (4) Hunter has not yet established internal accountability standards and procedures for employees or contractors failing to meet Hunter standards regarding slavery and trafficking.
- (5) Hunter is in the process of developing training on the issues of human trafficking and slavery, particularly with respect to mitigating risks within the supply chains of products. Such training will be directed towards Hunter employees and management, who have direct responsibility for supply chain management.
